Have you noticed your eyes may be irritated, throat scratchy, nose running and short of breath lately? You're not alone. the state issued an Air Quality Advisory for the Adirondacks and other regions of the state on Monday until midnight. According to the state Department of Environmental Conservation, the pollutant of concern is: Fine Particulate Matter.

"Fine particulate matter consists of tiny solid particles or liquid droplets in the air that are 2.5 microns (or micrometers). PM 2.5 can be made of many different types of particles and often come from processes that involve combustion (fires). Short-term health effects such as irritation to the eyes, nose, and throat, coughing, sneezing, runny nose, and shortness of breath. Exposure to elevated levels of fine particulate matter can also worsen medical conditions such as asthma and heart disease. "When outdoor levels are elevated, going indoors may reduce exposure. Ways to reduce exposure are to minimize outdoor and indoor sources and avoid strenuous activities in areas where fine particle concentrations are high." Purchase and install energy efficient lighting and appliances with the Energy Star label; and reduce or eliminate outdoor burning and attempt to minimize indoor sources of PM 2.5 such as smoking. Information on PM 2.5 is available on DEC's website and on DOH's website. We live in one of the most beautiful places in the world. It is a shame it has to be polluted with elements that most likely are not generated here. But we can certainly do our part to help alleviate the threat.

"You should always be careful when you're burning anything outside," said David Parrott, program administrator for the Ohio Division of Forestry.

The fire triggered a large response as crews went deep into the woods to get to work containing it. The Champion Township Fire Chief says it burned an estimated 70 acres. "While we were extinguishing that fire, we did find a little campsite that was set up in the middle of the operation.. Don't bring firewood to campsites: Here's why The fire was deep in the woods. With the terrain and wetlands, it was a little bit challenging to get to, but fire departments used some technology to help assist in their firefighting efforts. Through the use of the EMA office drone and its infrared technology, firefighters were able to get a better picture of how large the fire was and where to target their efforts. "Once it got dark, we were able to use the infrared technology and see if there was any free-burning areas still. With the dry stretch of weather expected to continue this week, officials are concerned about the enhanced fire risk. Parrott says when it comes to outdoor fires, you should check with your local fire department for

recommendations and make sure any fire is at least 100 feet away from wooded areas. The fire in Champion Township has since been contained, but crews will continue to monitor the area as a precaution.

Penetanguishene and Midland residents who qualify for the Meals on Wheels program through the Canadian Red Cross are being offered free home fire safety inspections by local fire departments.

Meals on Wheels is a food delivery service program of healthy, nutritious, delicious, and affordable meals for community members unable to prepare their own food, allowing further independence to participants. A recent partnership between the Red Cross and the joint municipal fire departments for Penetanguishene and Midland intends to extend fire safety to residents in those municipalities using the food delivery program. "We believe this is a great opportunity for both departments to share valuable life-saving information," said the firefighter/fire prevention inspector of Penetanguishene Fire and Emergency Services. Clients registered for Meals on Wheels will be asked by the Red Cross if they are interested in being part of the fire prevention program, and if the fire department has permission to attend their home during a food delivery to complete the inspection. "The benefits of this program," Bonnin explained, "are that residents who agree to participate can receive a complimentary life safety device (either a smoke or carbon monoxide alarm); they will also receive a home fire safety inspection to identify any potential hazards in the home." Bonnin said the collaboration has no set end date currently and will run as long as new residents join the program. Additionally, Bonnin expressed that everyone can benefit from what the fire departments are offering, as the joint fire departments do not charge for a requested single-family home fire safety inspection. "Both departments encourage any resident who would like a home fire safety inspection to contact their local fire department," said Bonnin, saying interested parties should ask to speak with the fire prevention officer. However, Bonnin noted that neither the Penetanguishene nor Midland fire departments can complete visual inspections of wood-burning appliances (WETT inspections) or inspections of fuel-fired appliances. And while the fire departments don't sell smoke or carbon monoxide alarms, Bonnin stated that information can be provided on which devices are recommended and where their placement in the home is required.
