In our continuing search for alternatives to residential wood burning, a new method of generating energy is being discussed in The Week, a weekly News Aggregator Magazine in their June 16, 2023, issue on page 21 in an article titled "Harvesting energy from the air".

Scientists have found a way to generate clean energy from the humidity in air. Just as the water droplets in a cloud can produce a lightning bolt, the air-powered generator, or "Air-Gen" uses ambient moisture to generate electricity. The "Air-Gen" is a thin film dotted with tiny holes called nanopores. When water in the air passes through the holes, it creates an electrical charge imbalance, forming a constantly running battery. Stacking more than one "Air-Gen" may amplify the power of one "Air-Gen". RAWSEP View: So, this is a battery, a tiny battery, which complements the usage of a very large, very heavy battery for storage, the "Iron-Air" battery which could be used to charge electric cars and to power the electric grid for up to 72 hours if there was a power blackout of that time period from wind, solar or geothermal sources. We've already heard about so-called "<u>fog harps</u>" that use thin wires to collect airborne water droplets, providing drinking water even in arid regions. Well, an experimental new device also uses wires to capture water vapor, although it proceeds to generate electricity. At the University of Massachusetts Amherst, the air-powered generator (or "Air-gen") incorporates a film made of nanowires. That film is sandwiched between two flat rectangular electrodes, although the one on top covers only part of the film, leaving the rest exposed to the air. Produced by the bacteria Geobacter, the nanowires are made of an electrically conductive protein. Because of this quality – along with their surface chemistry and the small size of the pores between them – the wires generate an electrical current between the two electrodes, whenever they absorb water vapor from the air. This is described in the journal <u>Nature</u>. Several years ago, MIT <u>developed a system</u> that generated electricity utilizing ambient water vapor, although it incorporated a series of water-repelling and water-attracting conductive plates.


