A Freedom of Information (FOI) request submitted to Lewisham and Greenwich NHS Trust revealed 1,481 children under five years old were admitted to hospital with respiratory difficulties in 2023. In the same year, 262 children younger than five with respiratory difficulties were admitted to hospitals in Lambeth under the King's College Hospital NHS Foundation Trust. Across 22 London hospitals surveyed, more than 15,000 children were admitted with serious breathing difficulties. Parents have been hanging baby grows that spell out 'Clean Air Now' near areas in breach of World Health Organization standards, including Lambeth Town Hall, near King's College Hospital. A Mums for Lungs member and Lambeth parent, said: "children are being hospitalized with breathing difficulties. I regularly smell the pollution in the air on our walk to school." Particulate matter (PM2.5) consists of fine particles that, once in the air, are harmful to human health. These are particles with a diameter of less than 2.5 micrometers that can penetrate deeper into the lungs, the heart and blood stream. Exposure has been linked to the increased likelihood of developing lung and heart conditions, cancer, strokes, mental health issues and dementia. Across the UK, there has been an 89 per cent increase in PM2.5 emissions from wood burning as a fuel between 2010 and 2021, according to statistics published by the UK Government. Joseph Carter, head of Asthma + Lung UK Scotland, said: "The idea of a cozy wood burning stove in the winter might sound appealing, but burning wood in our homes could be putting ourselves and our neighbors at risk and is a really inefficient way of heating a home.
