Early voting starts soon. Here are locations, dates and times for Milwaukee and the suburbs. Monday, October 21, 2024. In-person absentee voting, also known as early voting, starts on Tuesday, Oct. 22, in Milwaukee and across Wisconsin for the Nov. 5 election. Under Wisconsin law, voters do not need to provide a reason, such as being out of town on Election Day, to vote absentee. The early voting period typically starts two weeks prior to any election day, meaning most locations will begin accepting ballots in-person on Tuesday, Oct. 22, and will typically last until Sunday, Nov. 3. Early voting ballots are not typically accepted on the Monday before the election, which this year is Nov. 4. For the communities that offer early voting, locations, dates and times vary. Some municipalities do not offer it. Visit your local clerk's website for the most up-to-date information. Here's what to know about early voting in Milwaukee, its surrounding suburbs and other parts of southeast Wisconsin, as well as what to bring with you. Where do I vote early in Milwaukee? Wisconsin is one of the 21 states with same-day voter registration, meaning if you decide you want to vote Nov. 5, you can register at the polls when you get there. A guide to registering to vote in Wisconsin, including **key deadlines, the materials you need, how long registration lasts, who qualifies and more: Where and when can I register to vote in Wisconsin from October 17, 2024, onward to election day?** There are two ways to register to vote in Wisconsin after October 17, 2024: at your local clerk's office or at your polling place on Election Day. **At your clerk's office by Nov. 1 at 5 p.m.** You can visit your clerk's office during their business hours to register to vote, up until the Friday before the election at 5 p.m. You can find your clerk's address here. **At the polls on Election Day, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.** Wisconsin has same-day voter registration, so you can register when you get to your polling place. **What do I need to register to vote in Wisconsin?** You may have heard of Wisconsin's photo ID law, which requires you to show photo identification to vote. You don't need a photo ID when you're just registering to vote, but you will need it when you vote at your polling place or request an absentee ballot. Here's what materials you do need to register: **A Wisconsin driver's license or state ID card, if you have it.** If you have a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will need to provide the number and expiration date. If your license or ID card is revoked, suspended or expired, or if you don't have one, you will be asked for the last four digits of your Social Security number. If you have none of those things, there's a place to note that and more information on the back of the form. **Proof of residence.** This proves that you live in the place where you are registering to vote in Wisconsin. Acceptable documents are explained in the section below. Can I vote during work hours on Election Day? Yes, Wisconsinites have the option to vote on election day during their work hours. All employers in Wisconsin are required to give their employees up to three successive hours to vote on each election day, regardless of the size and type of business, according to Wisconsin voting law. However, Wisconsin's Department of Workforce Development notes that employees are required to notify their employers before election day that they intend to be absent to vote, and the employer gets to decide the time of day employees are excused to vote. Additionally, employers may deduct the time lost from pay, but they are not allowed to discipline or penalize employees for the absence. Can I work at a polling place in Wisconsin on Election Day? Wisconsin law also requires employers to allow employees who become poll workers to receive an unpaid leave of absence on Election Day, if they give seven days' notice. State employees who become election officials must continue to receive pay and benefits, according to the Wisconsin Elections Commission. Can my employer tell me who to vote for or penalize me for voting? No, employers are not permitted to make threats intended to influence the political opinions or actions of their employees, according to Wisconsin law. They also cannot distribute printed materials that threaten business shut down or reduction in salaries or wages based on the success of a certain political party, candidate or referendum. Additionally, all ballots are anonymous. Those who experience issues or barriers negotiating this process with employers are encouraged to reach out to the DWD and file a Labor Standards Complaint to protect their right to vote.
