2 United States and New Jersey Senator Cory Booker says Congress should hold hearings on whether insider trading on the Trump tariffs occurred **Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501c3 nonprofit organization** NBC News dot com and MSN April 13 2025 WASHINGTON Senator Cory Booker said Sunday that Congress should hold hearings and defended calls of Democratic lawmakers for investigations into any possibility of insider trading after Trump encouraged people to buy stocks before reversing his tariff policy last week There is enough of an offense here there is enough smoke here that should demand congressional hearings the New Jersey Democrat said Democrats began questioning whether anyone traded improperly after Trump said on social media that this is a great time to buy Wednesday morning when stocks were slumping after the Trump tariff rollout and then just hours later announced that most of the steep tariffs would be temporarily reduced sending the stock market shooting up When asked whether Democrats had any evidence of anyone profiting off of the Trump announcement Booker initially dodged the question and criticized the Trump administration emphasizing that Congress is responsible for oversight Asked a second time for evidence Booker argued for hearings adding that these are real legitimate justifiable questions Not to have hearings not to do any kind of oversight undermines the faith we have in our government undermines the trust we need in our nation right now Booker said Last week a group of 19 House Democrats sent a letter to the head of the Securities and Exchange Commission requesting an immediate investigation into possible insider trading and market manipulation in the days and hours leading up to the Trump reversal on tariffs Democratic senators Adam Schiff of California and Ruben Gallego of Arizona also sought answers from the White House on their concerns about any illegal actions related to the Trump tariff moves

The annual contribution limit for IRAs remains the same at \$7000 =People more than 50 years old can add \$1000 for an annual limit of \$8000

And how many times has it been proved wrong? Well maybe this time he really has overstepped After all his clowning around with tariffs sparking trade wars then suddenly reversing his position could provoke a global recession perhaps even a depression Surely his supporters will disown him? But I am not banking on it and this is why Already Trump has waged war on everything that builds prosperity and wellbeing democracy healthy ecosystems education healthcare science the arts Yet amid the wreckage and despite some slippage his approval ratings still hold between 43 and 48% far higher than those of many other leaders Why? I believe part of the answer lies in a fundamental aspect of our humanity the urge to destroy that from which you feel excluded **This urge I think is crucial to understanding politics Yet hardly anyone seems to recognize it Hardly anyone that is except the far right who see it all too well** In many parts of the world and the US in particular inequality has risen sharply since the late 1970s The UK tracks this trend The billionaires of the world became 2 trillion dollars richer last year while the number of people living below the global poverty line is more or less unchanged since 1990 There is strong evidence of a causal association between growing inequality and the rise of populist authoritarian movements the gap between the rich and the poor is roughly the same after taxes are levied suggesting that taxation has no further significant effect on income distribution How could this possibly be true when the rich pay higher rates of income tax? It is because the poor surrender a much higher proportion of their income in sales taxes Mainstream parties are currently not prepared to deliver greater equality The rich should be taxed more and the revenue used to improve the lives of the poor However frantically centrist parties avoid the issue there is no other way
