3 United States Tariffs The Trump Tariff Threat for Imported Medicines Poses Political Risks Levies on American daily prescriptions and other medicines could raise costs spur rationing and lead to shortages of critical drugs Most medications consumed in the United States are produced at least partly overseas China and India do most of the production of cheaper generic drugs while expensive patented medications are more often made in Europe or the United States [RAWSEP View](#) Increased costs of medicine will hit all income groups and may cause some to delay medical treatment and prescriptions [Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501c3 nonprofit organization](#) The New York Times April 15 2025 President The Trump decision to move a step closer to imposing tariffs on imported medicines poses considerable political risk because Americans could face higher prices and more shortages of critical drugs The Trump administration filed a federal notice on Monday saying that it had begun an investigation into whether imports of medicines and pharmaceutical ingredients threaten American national security an effort to lay the groundwork for possible tariffs on foreign made drugs Trump has repeatedly said he planned to impose such levies to shift overseas production of medicines back to the United States Experts said that tariffs were unlikely to achieve that goal Moving manufacturing would be hugely expensive and would take years It was not clear how long the investigation would last or when the planned tariffs might go into effect Trump started the inquiry under a legal authority known as Section 232 that he has used for other industries like cars and lumber Drugmakers importing from China into the United States have been subject to tariffs initially 10 percent and later 20 percent that Trump had imposed on Chinese imports earlier this year

4 California Climate After LA Fires Edison Wants to Bury Power Lines in Altadena and Malibu Southern California Edison is echoing calls from homeowners to move spark prone electrical equipment underground Company officials estimated the cost at more than six hundred fifty million dollars [RAWSEP View](#) This article points out the economic costs of human caused climate change [Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501c3 nonprofit organization](#) The New York Times April 11 2025 Southern California Edison the electric utility whose equipment has been the focus of investigations into the deadly Eaton fire in Los Angeles County in January said on Friday that it planned to bury more than 150 miles of power lines in fire prone areas near Altadena and Malibu Calif The project would require approval from state regulators would take years to complete and would cover only a fraction of the vast service area of the utility Still underground lines have been among the top requests from fire ravaged communities as Los Angeles looks to rebuild That amounts to about two thirds of the nearly one billion dollars that the utility estimated it would cost to rebuild the infrastructure that was damaged or destroyed in the wildfires that began on January 7 2025 Much of that cost is expected to be passed on to customers Officials said the project will address a significant risk in two of the most fire prone

areas in Southern California. Officials said at least 90 miles of power lines would be buried in Malibu and more than 60 miles in and around high risk fire zones in Altadena where the Eaton fire burned. Any move by Edison must be approved by the state utilities commission to ensure that the utility can recoup costs from ratepayers. Regulators have to balance the rising cost of electricity with the need for improvements to support safety and reliability.

Small and medium sized farms were already struggling amid worsening climate shocks and volatile commodities markets on top of being squeezed by large corporations that dominate the supply chain. In recent weeks farmers in Texas and across the Midwest have suffered millions of dollars of crop losses due to unprecedented heavy rainfall and flooding. The climate crisis fueled extreme weather is compounded by the Trump looming trade war and the administration targeting popular federal programs and staff leaving farmers reeling and resigned to needing another bailout. As of Friday at least 15 agricultural department programs worth billions of dollars to American farmers and rural communities remain frozen more than two months after they were halted for review to ensure compliance with The Trump priorities opposing diversity equity and inclusion DEI efforts as well as his crackdown on climate change initiatives. This includes the Biden era partnerships for climate smart commodities PCSC program a five year three point two billion dollar real life study into the effectiveness of conservation practices such as cover cropping and reduced tillage for commodity farms. On Monday the agriculture secretary Brooke Rollins defended dismantling PSCS claiming it amounted to a Biden era climate slush fund of which less than half the money went to farmers. A spokesperson added With 16 robust nutrition programs in place USDA remains focused on its core mission strengthening food security supporting agricultural markets and ensuring access to nutritious food. And some Trump supporters are keeping the faith. There are some concerns out there but our farmers are willing to make sacrifices for long term gains said the Texas agriculture commissioner. Tariffs are a temporary tool they wo not
