The New York Times October 3 2025 The appointment of Yuliia Svyrydenko a business oriented official shows how Kyiv is trying to persuade the Trump administration that working with the country can be lucrative even in wartime The Yuliia Svyrydenko debut trip to the United States as the prime minister of Ukraine began at a showcase of American capitalism On a late August morning she joined a crowd of investors in the Nasdaq building in Times Square to celebrate the first ever American listing of a Ukrainian company the telecom firm Kyivstar Suspenseful music throbbed as a countdown clock ticked to zero and Ms Svyrydenko rang the opening bell of the market It is rare for a prime minister to appear at the exchange and even rarer for a company from a war torn country to be listed on it Ms Svyrydenko in a recent interview in Kyiv with The New York Times said it showed Ukraine is not only about donations but it is about business Her words appeared calculated to resonate with President Trump He has long grumbled that the United States has not received anything in return for the tens of billions of dollars it has poured into the Ukraine war effort mostly under his predecessor President Biden With direct US financial assistance now off the table Kyiv is working to convince Trump that it is no charity case but a place where lucrative business can be done even in wartime Appointed by President Volodymyr Zelensky in the middle of July Ms Svyrydenko at age 39 seems tailor made for that task She has spent her career working in private businesses or on economic matters for regional and national governments As economy minister she negotiated a high stakes minerals deal with the Trump administration that has become the foundation for the new business oriented relationship between Kyiv and Washington Her appointment was a message from Ukraine to the United States to Trump said Mykola Davydiuk a Kyiv based political analyst The Ms Svyrydenko elevation also reflects a growing concentration of power under Zelensky according to Kyiv based Western diplomats and Ukrainian lawmakers Perhaps her biggest test came this year when Ukraine negotiated a deal to open its mineral riches to the United States hoping to win The Trump favor by appealing to his mercantile instincts Ms Svyrydenko led the talks for Ukraine as they quickly grew tense Washington made demands that felt to Ukrainian officials like outright extortion such as granting the United States half of the Ukraine mineral rights Ms Svyrydenko eventually secured better terms and signed the deal forging what she called a trust based working relation with Secretary Bessent One of the first acts of Ms Svyrydenko as prime minister was implementing the Zelensky push to expand government aid for Ukrainians One of her current priorities is securing Western funding to enhance Ukrainian air defenses which have been stretched thin by relentless Russian attacks The government building where she works is a reminder of the stakes Last month a Russian ballistic missile struck the upper floors just above her office The missile did not explode for reasons that remain unclear leaving a gaping hole and a lingering acrid smell of smoke

Four years ago the Czech Republic voted out its populist wealthy scandal-singed prime minister known as the Czech Trump. Now echoing President Trump's own comeback Andrej Babis prime minister from 2017 to 2021 is poised to return to that office potentially reviving a Euroskeptical government that experts say could trim military aid to Ukraine. His party ANO is expected to prevail in two days of parliamentary elections that begin Friday. Like Trump the 71-year-old Babis is more interested in taking a transactional approach with the European Union than in forging sweeping foreign policies. And like Trump he is expected to try to foist support for Ukraine onto European partners rather than share the load. Babis also is capitalizing on a wobbly economy to appeal to voters much as Trump did. No major Czech party is expected to win outright majorities in the 200-seat lower house of Parliament. The Babis ability to form a government may hinge on his willingness to bring political extremes into his coalition. At least two of the parties to which Babis would turn hold Euro- and NATO-skeptic or in favor of Russian views, said Daniel Hegeüs, director for Central Europe at the German Marshall Fund in Berlin. He said it would be a nightmare scenario for international European partners should Babis invite those parties to join the government. Their influence could turn the Czech Republic into a sort of naysayer on support for Ukraine. ANO, which means yes, has pledged to cut taxes, increase pensions, cap energy prices, and freeze salaries of politicians. It has also said it would eliminate fees that finance public television and radio, which is likened to a tax cut but one that opponents have criticized as giving the government more control over broadcast media. Hegeüs described the party as focused on economic and social issues without a strong ideology, although the government that Babis led when first elected prime minister was considered politically center-left. Last year Babis founded with others the Patriots for Europe, a right-wing main opposition party in the European Union with Prime Minister Viktor Orbán of Hungary. Experts predict that if elected Babis would align the Czech Republic with the nationalist policies of Hungary and Slovakia, both of which maintain ties with Russia. In a debate this week ANO joined mainstream parties in calling Russia the greatest threat to the Czech Republic. But Babis and other ANO leaders have been more circumspect about continuing military aid to help Ukraine defend against Russia and have played on weariness of voters with the three-year-long war to insist that support be diverted back into the Czech economy. Babis has also said he would scrap a multibillion-dollar program to supply Ukraine with desperately needed ammunition procured by Czech companies. Other ANO officials have since softened that stance, suggesting NATO manage it instead. The right-wing Freedom and Direct Democracy party or SPD and the left-wing STANO party have vowed to end Czech assistance to Ukraine and favor diplomacy with all key global players, including Russia. Babis may look to at least one of those if not both to create a coalition government. Vit Dostál, the executive director of the Prague-based research group Association for International Affairs, predicted that other European leaders would work to persuade Babis to continue the ammunition program under Czech auspices and keep Russia at bay. I do not think Merz wants another irritant in Europe, Dostál said, referring to Chancellor Friedrich Merz of Germany, one of the biggest backers of Ukraine. Politics at play: Babis has said he would prefer to govern alone in a minority government instead of creating a coalition like the center-right alliance led by the current prime minister.

Petr Fiala In that scenario Ano would run government ministries but partner with other parties on a case by case basis to push issues through Parliament It is also possible that Ano will coalesce with more mainstream political parties including from the Fiala government although he and Babis have dismissed that idea Such a step would be difficult for these parties to justify to their electorates yet it could be presented as a means to prevent extremists from gaining a foothold in the government an analysis by the Dostal organization concluded The Czech president Petr Pavel is expected to keep a steady hand on foreign policy The presidency is a largely ceremonial role but Pavel a former NATO general has had considerable influence on security issues It is unclear however how much sway he might maintain in a government led by Babis The two men faced off in a 2023 presidential election which Pavel won Initial election results could be announced as soon as Saturday evening although it could take weeks to form a government

Vought said 18 million dollars for infrastructure would be paused including funding for a new rail tunnel under the Hudson River. Affordability is key. **Those well to the left of Jennifer Granholm also called for a focus on affordability in the climate fight.** Politicians should prioritize green economic populist campaigns such as **fare free transit and the build out of decarbonized public housing.** On Wednesday of Climate Week progressives gathered. It has long been understood that if we are going to build a mass movement **people need to see the connection between the transition to renewable energy and spending less money.** Merely talking about affordability is not enough. **Trump for instance has failed to deliver on his promise of lowering bills while handing massive benefits to oil giants and other corporations.** We need to focus on actually bringing relief to

people And we see that when we really center people over profit people respond to that People can tell who is for real
