0 RAWSEP View It is known that wood burning emissions cause adverse health effects and early deaths to near neighbors In this case the permit for a Mississippi Biomass wood pellet plant has sparked protests from near neighbors who enumerate adverse health effects from the air pollution of the plant The adverse health effects directly from the burning of the wood occur in the United Kingdom where the wood pellets from the Mississippi plant are shipped Mississippi near neighbors to the wood pellet plant are suing A second point is that coal mining workers are suing Trump because of adverse health effects of working with coal which is a solid fuel like wood fuel with both creating PM 2 point 5 emissions injurious to human health although the dirty renewable wood burning emits 2 point 8 times the PM 2 point 5 and CO2 as the fossil fuel coal burning The health effects on near neighbors of burning wood are even more devastating than those from burning coal for that reason A third point in this episode is that rural voters should take note that a rural health fund has been cut by Trump

1 Mississippi residents sue UK owned biomass firm granted permit for more emissions Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501C3 nonprofit organization The Guardian October 18 2025 Nearby residents say they have had health concerns due to air pollution from Drax Biomass facility Residents of a small Mississippi town are suing Drax Biomass after the company won a permit to become a major source of hazardous air pollution at a local wood pellet production plant The subsidiary of the FTSE 250 energy company was previously denied permission to increase emissions in the 900 person town of Gloster Mississippi after local residents warned that they had already suffered serious adverse health consequences because of the operation But in a reversal of the April decision the Mississippi department of environmental quality MDEQ permit board on Wednesday granted the Drax Amite county wood pellet production facility a permit The plant in Gloster converts trees sourced from southern US states into wooden pellets which are burned as biomass fuel in the Drax huge power station in Selby North Yorkshire England Drax is expected to receive more than 10 billion pounds in UK renewable energy subsidies between 2012 and 2027 for its biomass generation according to the thinktank Ember despite criticism from green groups and climate scientists which claim that the wood it uses to manufacture biomass pellets is not sustainably sourced The company was found to have supplied inaccurate data relating to its sourcing of biomass leading to a 25 million pound 33 million dollar fine which was paid to the UK energy regulator The company is currently being investigated by the UK Financial Conduct Authority FCA and lawmakers in the UK have been reviewing the billions in renewables subsidies the North Yorkshire plant receives The new lawsuit against Drax alleges that the Amite county facility which shares a fence line with the larger community has unlawfully exposed locals to excessive levels of chemicals and pollutants It says those in turn have coated the homes of people and put them at greater risk of diseases such as cancer and respiratory illness Residents of the Gloster predominantly Black low income town have reported feeling dizzy getting headaches and otherwise feeling unwell since the facility opened a decade ago and they have expressed concern that any plans for increased emissions could worsen respiratory illnesses heart disease and other health issues linked to the pollutants The approval came despite the previous standards violations of the site which resulted in a

250 thousand dollar fine last year for releasing over 50 percent more harmful pollutants than allowed and a 2 point 5million dollar penalty in 2020 In a recent letter to the Mississippi governor and the MDEQ permit board 85 advocacy organizations expressed concern at the effect the Drax manufacturing has had on the Gloster residents and urged steps to ensure they can breathe clean safe air From young children with asthma who are unable to play outside to elderly residents reliant on costly breathing treatments it is clear that Gloster is a community in crisis the organizations wrote Those who can afford to leave are doing so they added while those who remain are left to suffer worsening health

Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501C3 nonprofit organization The New York Times October 18 2025 A federal judge threw out their climate lawsuit against the president a few days ago But legal experts say there was a silver lining in the opinion of the judge When a judge threw out a lawsuit this week accusing President Trump of violating the Constitution it was a major setback for a group of young people trying to fight climate change in the courts But the ruling had a silver lining The judge also said the plaintiffs had successfully argued that climate change constitutes a health emergency for children Legal experts said that language reinforced a yearslong strategy by an organization called The Trust of Our Children a public interest law firm to put children and young people in the courtroom and on the stand to argue that governments should do more to rein in global warming The opinion of the judge offered very detailed guidance for designing cases that can overcome the challenges this one faced The judge dismissed the case citing the legal precedent that a similar case had been thrown out earlier The court went out of its way he said to establish that the plaintiffs in the case Lighthiser versus Trump had successfully tied health risks for children to the Trump climate policies It did not have to But by doing so the ruling even though it is a clear loss for the plaintiffs will shape how other courts weigh similar arguments in the future The strategy of filing climate lawsuits with children and young people as plaintiffs has become a fixture of the legal landscape worldwide in recent years It can win sympathy and public attention for a case but it has its risks too For the plaintiffs there is the risk of putting children or young people on the stand and exposing them not only to cross examination but also potential public criticism or attacks more broadly As for the defense young plaintiffs can raise difficult questions about when or how aggressively to go about cross examining people who might be as young as elementary school age For example in the Montana case thrown out this week the Justice Department declined to cross examine two of the underage plaintiffs ages 17 and 11 during a two day hearing last month That hearing in the federal court in Missoula had moments of drama In the case filed in May a group of 22 young people led by The Trust of Our Children sued the federal government arguing that three of the Trump executive orders promoting fossil fuels would intensify climate change threatening the health of young people and violating the guarantees of life and liberty in the Constitution Government lawyers countered that the lawsuit was meritless and should be dismissed A 17 year old young woman of Livingston Montana was one of the plaintiffs who took the stand testifying about the difficulties of caring for her horses during wildfires Later listening to a defense argument that involved making a point about laws against speeding she scribbled a note to her lawyer People get a choice on how fast they go on the highway she wrote We cannot choose how much coal is driven through my town Later her lawyer Julia Olson read the note in court saying The plaintiffs always make me cry Your Honor But the case could not overcome what the defendants the president and a dozen federal agencies said was its fatal flaw They argued that it was a facsimile of a case filed a decade ago by The Trust of Our Children Juliana versus United States The US Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit the same court that would hear an appeal in this case previously had dismissed Juliana finding that the political branches of government not the courts were the appropriate venue for the plaintiffs demands Judge Christensen essentially concluded that his hands were bound by the precedent set by

that earlier decision Olson has vowed to appeal the decision of the judge Despite the recent setback The Trust of Our Children has had some high profile successes with the strategy of putting young people at the center of climate lawsuits The group won a closely watched case in Montana State Court in 2023 and came to a settlement last year in a lawsuit against the Hawaii Department of Transportation An emeritus professor at the Vermont Law and Graduate School was also unsurprised by the decision in the Lighthiser case given the precedent But he called the 31 page opinion of the judge groundbreaking and said it would help build a body of law on climate change and its effects on children No other US court decision has gone this far he said He also pointed to similar cases in Colombia and Germany as well as a recent International Court of Justice advisory opinion on the legal obligations of states with regard to climate change which was spurred by a yearslong campaign led by students from Pacific island countries That ruling of the court while lacking an enforcement mechanism said that governments must protect people from the urgent and existential threat of climate change The Juliana case has no path forward in US courts since the Supreme Court declined to hear an appeal However The Trust of Our Children is now bringing it to an international body the Inter American Commission on Human Rights which is part of the Washington based Organization of American States In a petition filed last month the group argued that the United States had violated international law by blocking access to justice for the young plaintiffs it was exceedingly rare to have testimony about climate change in a US federal court In her closing argument at the recent hearing in Montana Olson invoked another case in which children were plaintiffs Brown v Board of Education the 1954 Supreme Court case that declared segregation in schools unconstitutional The Trust of Our Children might have more success in electoral politics than in courts of law Climate change is ultimately a political issue he said It may be that these kids could have more of an influence on parents and grandparents in the voting booth than they are in the courtroom A photograph of A bag of colored markers and a hand drawn poster that reads in part Livable Future
