The editor of RAWSEP questions the projection of monetary corruption malfeasance that Trump is blatantly guilty of think of the 3 billion dollar pullback of IRA funds to fund tax break for the rich onto others and sweepingly onto particular ethnic groups Excerpts edited for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates The New York Times November 29 2025 Federal prosecutors charged dozens of people with felonies accusing them of stealing hundreds of millions of dollars from a government program meant to keep children fed during the Covid 19 pandemic At first many in the state saw the case as a one off abuse during a health emergency But as new schemes targeting the generous safety net programs of Minnesota came to light state and federal officials began to grapple with a jarring reality Over the last five years law enforcement officials say scores of individuals made small fortunes by setting up companies that billed state agencies for millions of dollars of social services that were never provided Federal prosecutors say that 59 people have been convicted in those schemes so far and that more than 1 billion dollars in taxpayer money has been stolen in three plots they are investigating That is more than Minnesota spends annually to run its Department of Corrections The Minnesota fraud scandal stood out even in the context of rampant theft during the pandemic when Americans stole tens of billions through unemployment benefits business loans and other forms of aid according to federal auditors Governor Tim Walz and fellow Democrats are being asked to explain how so much money was stolen on their watch Many Somali Americans in Minnesota

say the fraud has damaged the reputation of their entire community around 80000 people Critics of the Walz administration say that the fraud persisted partly because state officials were fearful of alienating the Somali community in Minnesota Governor Walz who has instituted new fraud prevention safeguards defended the actions of his administration Is the Minnesota Scandinavian modeled system of robust safety net programs bankrolled by high taxes sustainable? Tens of thousands of Somali refugees arrived in Minnesota after their country descended into civil war in the 1990s Ahmed Samatar a professor at Macalester College who is a leading expert in Somali studies said a reckoning over the fraud and its consequences for Minnesota was overdue American society and the denizens of the state of Minnesota have been extremely good to Somalis said Doctor Samatar who is Somali American Doctor Samatar said that Somali refugees were raised in a culture in which stealing from the Somali dysfunctional and corrupt government was widespread Minnesota he said proved susceptible to rampant fraud because it is so tolerant so open and so geared toward keeping an eye on the weak Other Somali Americans who have nothing to do with social service agencies said they had come to feel under siege amid all the fraud allegations and political accusations The actions of a small group have made it easier for people already inclined to reject us to double down said Abdi Mohamed a filmmaker in Minneapolis The broader Somali community hardworking family oriented and deeply committed to Minnesota is left carrying that burden

4 West Virginia and Virginia Huntington West Virginia and Dante and Pennington Gap Virginia Deeply demoralizing how Trump derailed the clean energy revival of coal country Biden earmarked billions for former coal communities in Appalachia and his successor Trump came and took it away [RAWSEP View](#) Trump is intent on protecting dirty energy industries even to the point of starting up dirty energy industries when the clean energy of wind and solar is cheaper for consumers in 2025 And in addition to that Trump is illegally eliminating the social programs that train former coal workers for new jobs in a clean energy economy Excerpts edited for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates The Guardian November 29 2025 For a moment Jacob Hannah saw an unprecedented opportunity to make Appalachia great again In 2022 the Biden administration earmarked billions of dollars to help revitalize and strengthen former coal communities The objective was to lay down building blocks for the region to transition from extractive industries like coal and timber to a hub for solar and other advanced energy technologies with a view to long term economic climate and social resilience But on his first day in office Trump scrapped the Biden clean energy and environmental programs A fifth generation Appalachian man has been crisscrossing the country on a mission to raise philanthropic capital to limit the economic damage caused by the Trump administration taking a chainsaw to Biden era grants Hannah runs Coalfield Development a nonprofit organization headquartered in Huntington focused on rebuilding the south west Virginia economy and social fabric through workforce training job creation and revitalizing abandoned buildings and mines in some of the most forgotten corners of coal country Coalfield has trained over 4 thousand people including many formerly incarcerated and/or in addiction recovery over the past 15 years in everything from solar installation to drywalling and first aid Yet historically federal grants for community regeneration efforts in Appalachia have been mostly top down project based and short lived The 2022 cash injection came through the Inflation Reduction Act IRA the Biden landmark climate and infrastructure legislation and was designed to help revitalize and strengthen former coal communities over the long haul It was the largest investment in Appalachia since the war on poverty of the 1960s under Lyndon Johnson In response Coalfield Development spearheaded a coalition of universities unions nonprofits businesses and local governments to create collective infrastructure and capacity enabling coal impacted rural communities across the US access more than 90 million dollars of the historic IRA investment Rural communities in Appalachia were on the verge of breaking ground on projects when the grants were paused or terminated by the so called department of government efficiency or Doge led by the billionaire Trump donor Elon Musk The wholesale cull included the 3 billion dollar Environmental and Climate Justice Program created

in the IRA to tackle the climate crisis and environmental harms at a local level. A few grants have since been reinstated but are subject to long delays in part because so many staff at federal agencies were forced out by Doge. Many remain the subject of litigation. Across Appalachia people who believe in Trump will be hit hard by his wholesale cuts to Medicaid veterans affairs food aid and education among other public services. Simultaneously the region is scrambling to save projects that would improve resilience and bring jobs. It is a race against the clock according to Hannah to find enough money to keep afloat and help people keep faith. The funding was committed by Congress so we know the law is on our side and that we will eventually win back some of these grants Hannah said. One objective was probably to remove confidence in the system so we need to outlast what is a game of cash flow and the battle of morale.

And what would be the purported cause of voter unhappiness in 2026? **Taxing the rich?** Deciding to cancel a subsidy for dirty oil for home heating and then only after being under pressure taking back that measure meant to increase clean air? **Providing rebates for clean energy Heat Pumps?** **Defending Ukraine?** Excerpts edited for brevity and clarity **and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates** **The New York Times** **November 26 2025** When the top economic official in Britain Rachel Reeves presented the budget of the government on Wednesday it was a make or break moment for her. No less on the hook was the man seated behind her Prime Minister Keir Starmer whose future may also depend on how voters and the financial markets judge her plan. The early response to Ms Reeves the chancellor of the Exchequer suggested that she threw Starmer at least a political lifeline. The tax and spending increases she announced went down well with Labor members of Parliament who had become restive with a government hobbled in its first 16 months by policy reversals. The markets also seemed satisfied. The pound rose against the dollar while the borrowing costs of the UK declined sparing Starmer the backlash that sank one of his Conservative predecessors Liz Truss when she rolled out a budget with sweeping tax cuts in 2022. **RAWSEP Interjection** The Liz Truss tax cuts of 2022 were designed to benefit only the wealthy and were reversed before Liz Truss was forced to step down as Prime Minister. **In 2025 Faced with unforgiving fiscal constraints Rachel Reeves announced tax increases on both wealthy and middle income people** **Farmers brought tractors to Trafalgar Square in central London on Wednesday to demand that Ms Reeves scrap inheritance taxes on family farms** **RAWSEP interjection** **RAWSEP wonders** if the gas to get to London was provided by the wealthy who exhorted farmers to act to protect the interests of the wealthy from tax cuts. **Back to the article excerpt** The Labor Party trails the right wing party against immigration the Reform UK by double digits in most opinion polls. Starmer does not have to call a general election until 2029. The respectable reception of the budget by Labor lawmakers and the markets would likely quiet any talk about elections to be held next spring. Nigel Farage the leader of Reform claimed that the budget would penalize working people to pay for wasteful welfare programs. He called it an assault on aspiration and an assault on saving. While the new taxes will affect people across multiple income levels **the budget does target wealthier people** Ms Reeves announced a surtax **known as a mansion tax** that would be levied on property worth more than 2 million pounds or 2 point 6 million dollars. **She had earlier tweaked inheritance taxes which brought angry farmers on tractors into London to protest** Among the most political decisions of Ms Reeves was eliminating the cap that had allowed parents to claim tax credits for only their first two children not all of them. After Ms Reeves took her seat a smiling Starmer put his arm on her shoulder. Starmer has kept Ms Reeves close even after she deepened the political woes of the government with the tax increases in her first budget last year and ignited a crisis by canceling a subsidy of **heating oil** **RAWSEP interjects** that heating oil is a dirty

energy source and the UK government has provided rebates for clean energy Heat Pumps and market reaction to cancelling a subsidy for dirty energy was probably the dirty energy industry reacting and influencing the markets in a coercive way Heating oil used by older people may be a sentimental but irrational desire to avoid change even if that change will make the lives of older people longer and healthier as long as they live [Back to the article excerpt](#) expenses for older people The government later reversed the plan While Ms Reeves has burrowed into economic policy Starmer has increasingly taken on the role of a statesman traveling the world He is spearheading efforts to marshal a European coalition of the willing to defend Ukraine and traveled to Washington to try to talk President Trump out of imposing tariffs on Britain Foreign policy successes might serve as a reminder of the danger that external shocks like the Trump trade policy pose to the economy of Britain This will probably be OK with the markets today

[Particulates](#) The Guardian November 29 2025 Kaja Kallas the European Union foreign policy chief asked her officials this week to dig up the number of times Russia had in its various guises invaded other states in the 20th and 21st centuries The answer that came back was 19 states on 33 occasions Kallas the former Estonian prime minister was not just indulging in some form of historical mathematics She was seeking to make a point that lies at the heart of the dispute between the US and Europe over the Ukraine future a dispute that has again revealed the chasm across the Atlantic about the true nature of the Russian regime Putin will come back for more A similar warning was made this week by the German foreign minister Johann Wadepful who said Our intelligence services are telling us urgently Russia is at least creating the option of a war against Nato by 2029 at the latest Putin is recruiting nearly one new division a month Divisions that are undoubtedly also targeting us at the EU at Nato The French president Emmanuel Macron has described Russia as a constant destabilizing power trying to revise the borders to extend his power In short he is a threat to Europeans The British prime minister Keir Starmer told MPs We know that without that deterrence Putin has the ambition to go again and he will go again – and we must guard against that With its overarching view that Russia under its current leadership would always represent a threat the key European focus has been to ensure any agreement prevents Russia from further military aggression The absolute condition for a good peace is a series of very robust security guarantees and not guarantees only on paper said Macron Some of those guarantees could be provided by a deployment of the so called coalition of the willing Starmer insists that plans are in place covering capability coordination and command structure but it is unclear whether the US will provide any additional guarantees Three Ukrainian red lines have been reserved for further talks conceding key parts of Donbas currently under Ukrainian control accepting restrictions on its army and Nato forever barring Ukraine from membership The damage to the transatlantic alliance piles up Europe now has to realize it must confront the Russian question alone Unlike in Alaska this time the US was lured into signing up to the Russian plans to remake Europe in the interests of Russia In so doing according to French historian Françoise Thom the US made itself complicit in the dismantlement of international law It is possible this Trump US initiative will fizzle out as Putin rejects the revised terms next week and the war grinds on after distracting and weakening Ukrainian morale that is already strained by allegations of corruption Some figures such as Kallas insist that Russia can be brought to breaking point as it runs out of money especially if Europe finds a lawful way to give Ukraine a reparations loan drawing on frozen Russian central bank assets worth 210 billion euros Trump may be planning a second summit with Vladimir Putin in Budapest Hungary

7 Ukraine In Firing His Number 2 Zelensky Loses Both a Negotiator and an Enforcer Andriy Yermak had ensured internal discipline in the wartime politics of Ukraine He also led the Ukraine peace negotiations which now must go on without him [RAWSEP View](#) It is true that 100 million dollars directed for the personal use of individuals rather than for needed infrastructure improvements makes the lives of average Ukrainians harder But being bombarded and killed by Russian drones is worse than any purported alleged corruption charges brought primarily to weaken the bargaining position of Ukraine in any peace talks Excerpts edited for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates [The New York Times](#) November 29 2025 The President Volodymyr Zelensky dismissal of his longtime right hand man opens a window for sweeping change inside Ukraine leaving Zelensky without a figure to enforce discipline within the Ukraine competitive politics as Russia always looks for seams to exploit The departure of the aide Andriy Yermak on Friday amid a corruption investigation also removes the Ukraine lead negotiator from difficult peace talks to end the largest war in Europe in generations But as a Ukrainian delegation was scheduled to continue negotiations this weekend in the United States now without Yermak Ukrainian officials insisted that the dynamics around the talks would not be fundamentally changed Detectives on Friday morning had searched the Yermak home after charging figures close to both the president and Yermak with embezzling about 100 million dollars from contractors to the state nuclear company Energoatom in a vast kickback scheme His firing eases worries in Ukraine that Russia or the United States will use the corruption scandal as leverage to push Ukrainian officials make painful concessions in talks An opposition political party European Solidarity had issued a statement on Thursday demanding The Yermak removal from the negotiating team for this reason Anticorruption activists say Yermak and another negotiator implicated in the corruption case Rustem Umerov the head of the National Security and Defense Council faced conflicts of interest in negotiations over provisions in the peace plan such as a proposed amnesty for wartime crimes Such a condition could cover the investigations targeting them The Yermak departure is a seismic event in the Ukraine wartime politics By systematically sidelining rivals in the Cabinet of Ministers and the presidential office he had won broad behind the scenes power He was a vice president a prime minister and a chief of staff rolled into one analysts said Anticorruption activists cheered his departure With Yermak no longer around to ride herd on domestic policy keep a lid on power struggles within the military and oversee peace negotiations The Zelensky political control may weaken Zelensky has said he will consult with Ukrainian politicians and generals before appointing a replacement In an interview Friday Yermak said he planned to join the military and serve on the front lines
