1 US House Democratic Discharge Petition to force consideration of expiring Obama Care subsidies
Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501C3 nonprofit organization The Hill November 13 2025 House Democratic leaders introduced a discharge petition Wednesday designed to force consideration of legislation to extend expiring Obama Care subsidies for another three years Behind House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries Democrat of New York the Democrats are hoping to entice a handful of moderate Republicans to endorse the petition which will require 218 signatures to force a floor vote on the legislation over the objections of Republican leaders The battle over the enhanced Affordable Care Act ACA tax credits has consumed Capitol Hill throughout the history making federal shutdown as Democrats had demanded action on the subsidies as a condition of reopening the government Republicans who have sought to repeal Obama Care for years rejected that demand And they won the long standoff over the weekend when a small group of Senate Democrats cut a bipartisan deal to reopen the government without any GOP concessions on the health care subsidies As part of that deal Senate Majority Leader John Thune Republican of South Dakota has guaranteed the Democrats a vote on the ACA tax credits in December But Speaker Mike Johnson Republican of Louisiana has declined to make a similar commitment The House discharge petition is designed to go around Johnson and force the bill to the floor if it can get a majority of House lawmakers to sign on While Obama Care has been a partisan issue for years some Republicans are already clamoring for an extension of the subsidies urging GOP leaders to address the issue before the premium hikes go into effect on January 1 2026 ahead of the midterm elections Legislation sponsored by Representative Jen Kiggans R Va would extend the tax credits for one year It has the support of 14 other centrist Republicans many of them facing tough reelection contests next year It is unclear if any of those lawmakers would take the additional step of bucking their leadership by endorsing the Democratic discharge petition

2 The Epstein Shutdown ends **Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501C3 nonprofit organization** Substack Letters from an American Heather Cox Richardson November 12 2025 It turns out Representative Eric Swalwell D CA and House Democrats were right to call it the Epstein Shutdown for the last several weeks on social media and in interviews As Marc Elias of Democracy Docket put it today while it was clear what the Democrats wanted from the shutdown lower costs for healthcare insurance premiums affordability and for Trump to stop breaking the law it was never clear what the Republicans wanted They seemed simply to be doing as Trump demanded Speaker Mike Johnson Republican of Louisiana kept House members from conducting any business at all The House last voted on September 19 gathering in Washington DC again only after the Senate on Monday passed a measure to reopen the government The hiatus gave Johnson an excuse not to swear in Representative elect Adelita Grijalva Democrat of Arizona whose voters elected her on September 23 Grijalva had promised to be the 218th and final vote on a discharge petition that would force the House to vote on a measure that would require the Department of Justice to release files relating to the government investigation into sex offender Jeffrey Epstein Elias notes that he like many of us considered as plausible the idea that the government shutdown was a way to keep the Epstein files under wraps but there were other plausible theories as well Maybe Trump and his cronies wanted to gut the federal workforce Maybe they wanted

to undermine the Affordable Care Act. Maybe Trump simply wanted to run the country without the interference of Congress. Today put the Epstein files firmly in the center of the story. The House got down to business this morning after a 54 day break to work on the Senate measure to reopen the government. Democrats on the House Committee on Oversight and Government Reform immediately released three emails from a cache of more than 23000 documents the committee received recently from the Epstein estate. As Representative Thomas Massie Republican of Kentucky who backed the House discharge petition told CNN This vote is going to be on your record for longer than Trump is going to be president. And what are you going to do in 2028 and 2030 when you are in a debate and they say How can we trust you? You covered up for a pedophile back in 2025. Midday today as new revelations from the Epstein documents were hitting social media every few minutes Representative Swalwell posted This is the beginning of the end. Tonight the House passed the continuing resolution of the Senate to fund the government ending the longest government shutdown in US history 43 days. The vote was 222 to 209 with all but two Republicans voting in favor and all but six Democrats voting against it saying they would not support a continuing resolution that did not extend the premium tax credits for healthcare insurance purchased on the Affordable Care Act markets. Republicans neglected to extend those credits in their budget reconciliation bill of July the one they call the One Big Beautiful Bill Act and without them millions of Americans will be unable to afford healthcare coverage and premiums will skyrocket for millions more. The measure funds the government through January 30 2026 overturns the layoffs of federal employees administration officials made during the shutdown and guarantees pay for workers and appropriates money to pay for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program SNAP benefits through September 2026 taking them out of The Trump hands as a pressure point in January. Failing to get an extension of the healthcare premium tax credits into the continuing resolution House Democrats filed a discharge petition to force the House to vote on a measure that would extend the credits for three years. There are only two ways this fight will end. Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries Democrat of New York told his colleagues. Republicans could finally decide to extend the Affordable Care Act tax credits this year. Or the American people will throw Republicans out of their jobs next year and end the speakership of Trump once and for all.

A deep dive into the US health care system rising costs corporate takeover and why reform keeps failing. We could be on the verge of ending the longest government shutdown in US history though nothing is guaranteed. While Congress debates whether to extend subsidies for the Affordable Care Act ACA coverage Americans with all types of insurance are bracing for higher premiums narrower networks and more impossible choices. So to me the debate in Washington is far too small. The real story is not just whether subsidies stay or go it is how completely insane our health care system has become and whether there will be a serious effort to address underlying costs in the system. I know just enough to get in trouble so I partnered with a leading national policy expert in this area to break down the five ways the entire system has gone off the rails. Let us dig in. 1 Costs vs wages A 20 year disconnect. Over the past two decades the cost of employer sponsored health insurance how the vast majority of privately insured Americans obtain their health care has skyrocketed. Premiums deductibles and out of pocket costs have all soared far faster than wages. This widening gap means workers earn less even when their salaries rise on paper. Every dollar going to premiums is a dollar not going to rent groceries or childcare. And the human toll is clear. One in three Americans has medical debt and more than half worry they will fall into debt any time they use the health care system. That fear changes behavior people delay appointments skip medications or avoid care altogether. Medical debt is now the most common form of debt in collections ahead of credit cards utilities or personal loans. Nearly 60 percent of those in medical debt have insurance. 2 We pay the most and get the least. The United States spends far more on health care than any other wealthy

country yet achieves worse outcomes less access and a more demoralized workforce Despite record spending Americans live shorter sicker lives than peers in Europe Canada or Japan Infant mortality maternal mortality and chronic disease rates all rank near the worst among high income nations A key reason is that we pour money into specialty medical services while underinvesting in prevention such as primary care and social supports like housing and nutrition Access Critics often argue that at least we do not have long wait times like other countries However increasingly the opposite is true and this is never a fair comparison as we spend twice as much as they do More than 100 million Americans live in a primary care desert while almost 60 million live in a pharmacy desert Services to treat mental health are notoriously lacking and Medicare does not even cover long term care Clinician workforce Health care workers are burning out or leaving the profession altogether Home health care aides are paid extremely low wages for heroic work As corporations attempt to convert salaried positions into gig work some nurses are compelled to bid against one another for shifts Many physicians report moral injury working in systems that prioritize billing over care eroding autonomy and morale 3 Americans do not overconsume health care Prices and private bloat drive costs There is a common myth especially amongst policymakers that we spend too much on health care because we consume too much of it A similar narrative has taken hold about doctors because they get paid for each service they provide too much care Certainly there is low value care in the US health care system And as profit seeking corporate actors own more and more of the system they are finding ways to bill for more— and more expensive services But Americans do not visit the doctor more we do not go to the hospital more and we do not stay in the hospital for longer We even get significantly fewer of many of the most popular procedures like coronary angioplasties knee replacements hip replacements and gall bladder and prostate removals The real difference is price A colonoscopy or MRI can cost 10 times more at one hospital than another across town depending on which insurer you have These differences have little to do with quality or cost of care They are the result of opaque negotiations between insurers hospitals and pharmacy benefit managers and other middlemen in the system We have created a system where no one knows what anything costs not the doctor not the patient sometimes not even the insurer The surprise bill arrives weeks later On top of high prices our system is drowning in private sector bloat and bureaucracy More so than any other country Every insurer has its own prices and endless price negotiations with providers billing processes prior authorization rules and reporting requirements The result is staggering inefficiency roughly one in four dollars spent on health insurance goes to something other than care like marketing billing profits or middlemen Doctors spend nearly half their time on paperwork Patients spend hours on hold fighting over denied claims And all of it is baked into costs 4 Corporate and financial firms have taken over care Perhaps the most underappreciated transformation of the past 40 years is the corporate consolidation and financialization of medicine Care delivery once local and community based is now dominated by corporations Vertical consolidation is now a defining feature of American health care UnitedHealth Group is not just the largest insurer it is also the largest employer of physicians and the largest operator of home health and hospice agencies CVS Health the largest pharmacy chain also owns the biggest pharmacy benefit managers and now giant insurer Aetna McKesson a pharmaceutical distributor now operates the largest chain of oncology practices in the nation and is rapidly expanding into other specialties These combinations raise all the conflicts of interest you would expect higher prices business steered away from independent providers and pharmacies gaming regulations and more Hospitals have been on a similar trajectory No longer charitable facilities they have been buying up physician practices starting insurance plans and operating financial investment firms Public hospitals have declined sharply while giant for profit systems have expanded nationwide In half of US metro areas just one or two systems dominate the market Then there is private equity PE From 2000 to 2020 the PE footprint in health care exploded 25 fold from 5 billion dollars to more than 100 billion dollars a year in deals totaling over 1 trillion dollars Private equity firms now own everything from nursing homes and hospices to emergency departments and physician practices Their model is simple buy up fragmented practices cut labor costs raise prices and resell for

profit Evidence shows quality declines and in some cases mortality rises after PE takeovers 5 Existing approaches have failed—and the latest proposals are more of the same None of this happened by coincidence Our current governing approach began in the 1980s when a bipartisan consensus emerged around how to address accelerating costs in the system The idea was to embrace more free market principles in health care resulting in three significant shifts in how we approached policy 1 Private insurers compete for patients called managed competition which was hypothesized to lower costs and improve quality In reality the government pays hundreds of billions to the largest insurance companies in the nation which now operate most of Medicaid and Medicare and all of the ACA exchanges The same happened with prescription drugs instead of Medicare negotiating prices directly with pharmaceuticals it is now the job of pharmacy benefit managers PBMs costing Americans more 2 Overreliance on economic incentives the notion that physicians and patients will not do the right thing unless they have more skin in the game Democrats embraced this ideology by pushing physicians into value based care a rebranding of HMO style managed care and a close cousin of privatized Medicare On the patient side Republicans insisted that they actually needed higher deductibles so they would ration their care more wisely But again Americans do not use too much health care Plus a patient cannot shop for emergency surgery or chemotherapy 3 Commercialization The US began converting public hospitals to for profit chains and abandoned care delivery models with commitments to voluntarism for example actual nonprofits and professional ethics for example clinician owned medical clinics The current debate recycles the same logic more private control higher out of pocket costs and less regulation of prices or profits The latest idea is that deductibles need to be higher and patients do not pay enough This approach has failed for 40 years It will continue to fail because it does not address the true crisis of US health care high costs from high prices especially for new technology consolidation and extraction at every level and lackluster and misallocated capacity Bottom line The US health care system is uniquely dysfunctional A different approach is entirely possible if we have the will to boldly govern the health care system in the interests of patients clinicians and taxpayers That means directly tackling prices eliminating middlemen and breaking up behemoths It also means returning ownership of care delivery to clinicians and communities and pursuing a strategy that builds the workforce and capacity to meet the needs of Americans Health touches everyone and we need a system that works for us not one that makes us work for it Love YLE and HR L

4 How to Pick Up the Local Language Before You Travel Speaking even trying to speak a language will help open doors on your next trip and achieving a survival level might be easier than you think Excerpts edited by RAWSEP for brevity and clarity and relationship to Residents Against Wood Smoke Emission Particulates a 501C3 nonprofit organization The New York Times July 21 2025 There are plenty of reasons to learn a foreign language before you travel Perhaps you are venturing beyond major tourist centers or you want to be prepared for emergencies Whatever the reason speaking even a few words of the local language with residents can quickly elevate you from mere tourist to sympathetic traveler Aim to reach a survival level before you travel That means abandoning your inhibitions and not getting hung up on grammar or achieving proficiency Travelers can connect and communicate surprisingly well at this level which he described as a speaking style akin to that of a toddler that gets the point across Reaching survival level means focusing on a core of essential verbs words like go see eat drink have do and be then learning a small vocabulary of other words centered on your particular interests for a given trip Then you can literally build a hundred sentences around that Learning those right words does not happen overnight Getting beyond the transactional tourist tropes of Where is the bathroom? and Check please for example can take anywhere from one to three months of daily practice although everyone learns differently As with a fitness program you get out of language study what you put in The trick is finding what works for you Hit the apps Diplomats chief executives and missionaries often learn languages in high intensity immersive environments with dedicated instructors For the rest of us an app is often the first step One language learning expert prefers Babbel More important than any specific app or method

is to get started right away and practice every day. Shorter consistent sessions are more effective than longer sporadic ones. There is a big time and effort commitment when you learn a language. So you definitely need to find something that you enjoy making it more fun to practice regularly she added. Test out different apps like Duolingo, Babbel, Memrise and Busuu, which all offer either free versions or free trials to see which one works for you. The language expert recommends systems that employ spaced repetition, an evidence based learning technique that reviews and repeats material at increasing intervals. Some apps like Duolingo use spaced repetition but do not always provide authentic cultural context which is important for learning intuitively. Some learners have had success conversing and drilling with AI chatbots in voice mode. And Google whose Translate app is already indispensable for travelers recently released Little Language Lessons, a free customizable interactive tool that uses AI. Speaking with another person can help you make progress and apps like HelloTalk or Tandem, which both offer free versions can be a good way to find a partner who speaks your target language and wants to learn English. For an entertaining way to learn stream a foreign movie or TV show turn on the English subtitles and try to follow along. To improve listening comprehension cue up music in a foreign language and view the lyrics using Spotify. If apps are not your thing consider time tested alternatives like in person classes, language groups, practice sessions with a fluent friend, books, audio guides or flash cards. Many of these resources are free at your local library. Be brave and resist falling back on English. Do not fear being laughed at or scolded for speaking imperfectly. Once you are at your destination resist the urge to initiate or respond in English and try to speak the local language whenever people are receptive. It is fine to seek help with pronunciation or in finding the right word or to ask speakers to slow down or repeat themselves. You are going to make mistakes and run into limits and that is all right. You do not need thousands of words just the right ones and the confidence to use them.

Ladapo and Ultimate Human podcast host Gary Brecka mingled with RFK Junior at a party in the hotel lobby. The next day attendees included Dennis Kucinich the former Democratic lawmaker who was briefly the RFK Junior presidential campaign manager. Regenerative farmers had coffee at the sleek hotel bar and wellness influencers shook hands and unpacked swag bags. Food and Drug Administration Commissioner Marty Makary said hello. It was a strange mix of bedfellows: Biotech executives including Regeneron fellow founder and science chief George Yancopoulos and CRISPR Therapeutics CEO Sam Kulkarni alongside conservative wellness influencers like Brecka and actor Russell Brand. Mehmet Oz who oversees Medicare and Medicaid. Jay Bhattacharya who directs the National Institutes of Health also attended. A MAHA Summit minus the radical transparency. Leaders of biotech firms who may be skeptical of the RFK Junior agenda, the Trump MAGA base and the RFK Junior MAHA coalition. The summit could be potentially lucrative for companies. Hundreds of people across government, the health care industry, venture capital and MAHA groups. The gathering was closed to the press. Around noon RFK Junior showed up to a fireside chat with Vance. The vice president adopted the RFK Junior signature skepticism of traditionally accepted public health interventions. His appearance attendees said was interpreted as a clear signal of the importance of the MAHA movement to the future of the Republican coalition. I do not like taking medications, Vance said, mentioning an aversion to ibuprofen. I do not like taking anything unless I absolutely have to. And I think that is another MAHA style attitude. Attendees were given swag bags loaded with MAHA friendly goodies: Creatine by Momentous, Vandy potato crisps which are cooked in beef tallow and a copy of *The Real RFK Junior: Trials of a Truth Warrior* published by Skyhorse which was founded by Tony Lyons, the leader of MAHA Action. Officials emphasized their work prioritizing primary care and expanding access to GLP-1. Oz told attendees that GLP-1 pills would be coming in March. The Trump administration announced earlier this month that oral versions of the weight loss drugs which it pledged to review for approval much faster than usual — would cost 150 dollars through the direct-to-consumer Trump Rx platform. At the Health Defense of Children (HDC) conference last weekend in Austin, Texas, a gregarious man approached holding two tall plastic tubes he said contained clots from COVID-vaccinated bodies. After 36 years in the Air Force, he told me he had been pushed out for refusing the shot. Now in retirement, he calls funeral homes and surveys undertakers to document alleged vaccine harms. Over the next two days, I heard versions of the same arc again and again: loss reframed as mission, grievance redirected into organizing. I came to HDC out of curiosity to hear how this movement wins people over and why its message resonates so deeply. Over two days, I spoke with dozens of attendees between sessions and as a guest on the podcast *Why Should I Trust You?* I did not change any minds nor did my convictions waver.
